



Policy Statement

EACOP Limited is dedicated to the achievement of excellence in Major Accident Prevention best practices across all aspects of its activities conducted by or on behalf of EACOP. This Major Accident Prevention Policy outlines our commitment to preventing major accidents and protecting human health and the environment.

Commitments & Approach

- **Regulatory Compliance:** EACOP will comply with all relevant laws, regulations, and industry standards. All activities undertaken are conducted in accordance with the commitments and responsibilities stated in the Health, Safety, Security, Environment & Social Policy and the EACOP Integrated Management System (EIMS).
- **Leadership & Responsibilities:** The Company's senior management is committed to providing the resources, support, and leadership necessary to implement and sustain effective prevention of major accidents.
- **Hazard Identification & Risk Assessment:** For any activity, the hazards to which people, the environment and assets are exposed are systematically identified, the associated risks assessed and the measures for reducing them to a level as low as reasonably practicable (ALARP) defined and implemented accordingly. The risk level and risk reduction measures are constantly reassessed.
- **Operations Control:** EACOP is committed to the safe, reliable, and efficient operation of our facilities. Central to this commitment is our dedication to asset integrity management, which encompasses the systematic approach to ensuring that our assets are designed, operated, and maintained to meet performance and safety standards throughout their entire lifecycle.
- **Management of Change:** The management of change process is conducted in line with EACOP Integrated Management System (EIMS) procedures and processes. When changes are deemed necessary, their impact on organisational structure and/or major accident hazards is reviewed and mitigation measures implemented.
- **Contractor Management:** Our contracting partners are selected based on their ability to manage the risks associated with the activity being undertaken, their HSE Performance, and their ability to comply with EACOP's HSE requirements. Contractors will be monitored for their compliance with contractual requirements.
- **Competence & Training:** Competency and Training programmes are formalised and implemented to ensure that all personnel involved in safety critical tasks are competent, adequately trained, and equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to effectively perform their duties.
- **Performance Monitoring:** Key performance indicators are defined annually. The objectives and plans are established through incident analysis, audit results and risk analysis. Performance is monitored operationally on a daily basis and reported Companywide on a monthly basis.
- **Audit & Review:** To ensure the continued compliance with the MAPP and associated systems controlling major accident hazards, regular audits and inspections are conducted. In addition, independent audits shall be scheduled on an annual basis to ensure compliance with company policies and procedures. Identified corrective actions shall be implemented to agreed timescales.
- **Emergency Preparedness:** Emergency response plans and means of intervention are implemented and systematically tested. Personnel are trained and regular exercises conducted.
