

East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP) Ltd invites eligible and reputable Tanzanian companies to submit an Expression of Interest for the construction of village dispensaries and associated staff houses intended to improve access to primary healthcare services in areas where EACOP Pipeline traverses the vulnerable ethnic groups self-identifying as indigenous people communities.

The EACOP Project involves the construction and operation of an underground cross-border pipeline for the transportation of crude oil from the Lake Albert area in Uganda to the eastern coast of Tanzania for export to international markets. In Tanzania, the pipeline traverses eight regions, namely Kagera, Geita, Shinyanga, Tabora, Singida, Dodoma, Manyara, and Tanga.

As part of its commitment in the EACOP plan for Vulnerable ethnic groups self-identifying as indigenous people, EACOP Ltd intends to support the delivery of health infrastructure for Vulnerable Ethnic Group self-identifying as Indigenous Peoples in selected districts within Tanga, Manyara, and Dodoma Regions.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE SCOPE OF WORKS:

EACOP Ltd intends to implement the construction and of dispensaries as community benefit commitment projects in selected districts across Tanga, Manyara, and Dodoma Regions, in accordance with applicable Government of Tanzania health infrastructure requirements, national building codes, and other relevant statutory and regulatory standards.

The proposed works include construction of dispensary buildings in Kwedigongo Village (Mabanda Ward) and Kibaya Village in Handeni District; Jungu and Lekitinge Villages (Kisangasa Ward), Kekwinkembe Village (Mkindi Ward), and Ngobore Village (Saunyi Ward) in Kilindi District, Tanga Region; Mwitikira Village (Olboroti Ward), Loolera Village and Amei Village (Loolera Ward), and Kimana Village (Partimbo Ward) in Kiteto District, Manyara Region; and Mtiryangwi Village (Hondomairo Ward) in Kondoa District, Dodoma Region. The works also include construction of one medical staff house at Napilikunya Hamlet, kimana village, Kiteto District, and Manyara Region.

The contractor shall be responsible for execution of the works, including substructure, superstructure works, roofing, plumbing, electrical installations, water supply and sanitation systems, drainage, civil, finishes, land scaping, testing and commissioning, and all related external works necessary for completion of functional facilities.

All works shall be executed using durable materials and workmanship that comply with applicable Tanzanian standards and Good International Industry Practice.

EACOP is seeking a reputable company with demonstrated track record of undertaking the construction of health facilities in rural areas in accordance with the Tanzania standards and good international industry practice.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

Companies expressing their interest are invited to document their request with:

- Details of relevant experience in construction of health facilities in Tanga, Manyara, and Dodoma.
- Details of the ability to perform all works. Interested companies can enter into an agreement with other companies to enhance their service offering, however, all and each partner in the agreement MUST meet the COMPANY requirements.
- Proof of registration with relevant Tanzanian Registration Bodies (current BRELA search).
- Tanzanian National Contractors (Building) Registration minimum Class IV (submit copy).
- Proof of registration with the Tanzania Revenue Authority and Tax (TRA) Clearance Certificate for the latest year available.
- Registration with EWURA Local Supplier Service Provider (LSSP) database or an accepted application for registration at the time of submission of the response to this expression of interest is required.
- Compliance with Local Content Regulations, 2017 and Local Company definition.
- Financial capacity to deliver the services required including submission of financial accounts for year.
- Provide/demonstrate HSE (OSHA), Social and Quality Assurance and Control policies.
- Provide/demonstrate experience with project management techniques and controls, as well as large scale logistics and procurement capabilities.
- Evidence of a QHSE Management system, organization, and process in compliance with applicable Local and Industry standards for similar works.
- Proof of Anti-corruption, Anti-bribery, Compliance and Human Rights policies.
